## How do I find my polling place?

The voter card you receive from the county lists the location of your neighborhood polling place. If you've misplaced your card, call your county election administrator at 375-6550 to find out where to vote.

## What happens when I arrive at the poll?

When you arrive at your polling place, an election judge will greet you, ask your name, and confirm that you are registered to vote in that precinct. He or she will also ask you to show identification. This can be any current photo ID that shows your name (for example, a valid driver's license, school ID, state ID, or tribal ID) or a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, voter card, government check or other government document that shows your name and current address
